

Deacon Jeff's Corner

In the wake of the death of Charlie Kirk a few weeks ago, and the various comments I have received of different perspectives. I thought it best to address this incident as Pastoral Leader. First, a few opening comments: I knew very little of Mr. Kirk before his death, but it is almost impossible since then not to learn the different and polarizing opinions there were/are of him. Second, I will rely heavily here on someone whom I have great respect for, our shepherd and Bishop, David Ricken, for his thoughts, which seem to align with how I feel about this tragic incident.

Some have been very upset with me that I have not commented specifically about Mr. Kirk during our Masses. My response is this: We have many tragedies throughout the year, many of which are not specifically addressed. The shooting at Annunciation Catholic Church in Minneapolis hit home with me, as we constantly attempt to have the safest environment here as possible. The children who were killed and their families, along with so many young people who are scarred for life, affected me deeply, so I have included them in the petitions for a few weeks. Although not specifically, we have also addressed in the petitions the "senseless violence" in our country.

Bishop Ricken has this to say about why he watched the funeral service of Charlie Kirk:

"As the Bishop of Green Bay, I often find myself navigating through tensions in our increasingly divided world...The mention of the name Charlie Kirk can spark strong reactions. Yet, I try to build bridges and encourage dialogue."

"It is important for me to mention how I will be watching his memorial vigil today and why — Not to stoke division, but to honor a life that embodied courage in sharing truth, even amid fierce disagreement, and how his faith seemed to compel him to proclaim those truths even unto death."

"I'm drawn to Charlie's example of listening. For over a decade, he invited people—many who vehemently disagreed—to step up to the microphone and dialogue; and, imperfect as he was, he modeled respectful exchange while holding firm to truth. As Catholics, we can learn from this. Our Church thrives on dialogue, not division. Let's listen to all we're hearing, take it in and take it to prayer, and then let's commit to more listening and fostering mutual respect that changes culture for the better."

I pray for the repose of the soul of Charlie Kirk, I pray for the alleged shooter, for forgiveness and for a renewal of his heart to listen to the voice of our Lord and Savior, Jesus, to change him and be able to ask for sincere forgiveness from his heart and soul. Please, my friends, continue to pray our society may include our faith in everything we do!







Our Psalm for this Sunday begins with these words: "Blessed is he who keeps faith forever, ...". Psalm 146, verse 7. Our reading from the prophet Amos 6:1a begins with more than a warning ...it begins with a "woe"! "Thus says the Lord the God of host: Woe to the complacent...!"

Complacent / how's this for a definition: "overly self-satisfied and unconcerned, often to a fault, about potential problems or areas of improvement. .. content with their current situation .. may not feel the need to strive for better .. a lack of awareness or effort."

There certainly seems to have been a lack of "awareness or effort" by the rich man who "dined sumptuously" and the poor man Lazarus "..lying at his door.." In our Gospel.

Saint Paul certainly is telling us what we ought to be about: "..pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. Compete well for the faith." Nothing about being complacent in Paul's mind: "I charge you ..to keep the commandment .. until the appearance of our Lord Jesus Christ." Now that sounds like "forever", and forever is a really long time.

And how about looking at this "power-packed" liturgical week. A Feast and three Obligatory Memorials: Archangels and Guardian Angels, Jerome, and Therese (the "Little Flower"). Certainly nothing "complacent" in their lives! It'll be white vestments for most of the week.

On another note, did you miss me this weekend? I'm in Milwaukee for the Trusted Fraternal Life convention with the theme: "Inspiring Lives of Service". TFL is "A Family of Brands" and I am the spiritual director for Branch 6 of Catholic Financial Life; I'll be concelebrating at the 9:00 a.m. Mass at the Cathedral in Milwaukee this Sunday. I'll be back to celebrate those Obligatory Memorials. Keep the Faith! Forever!


