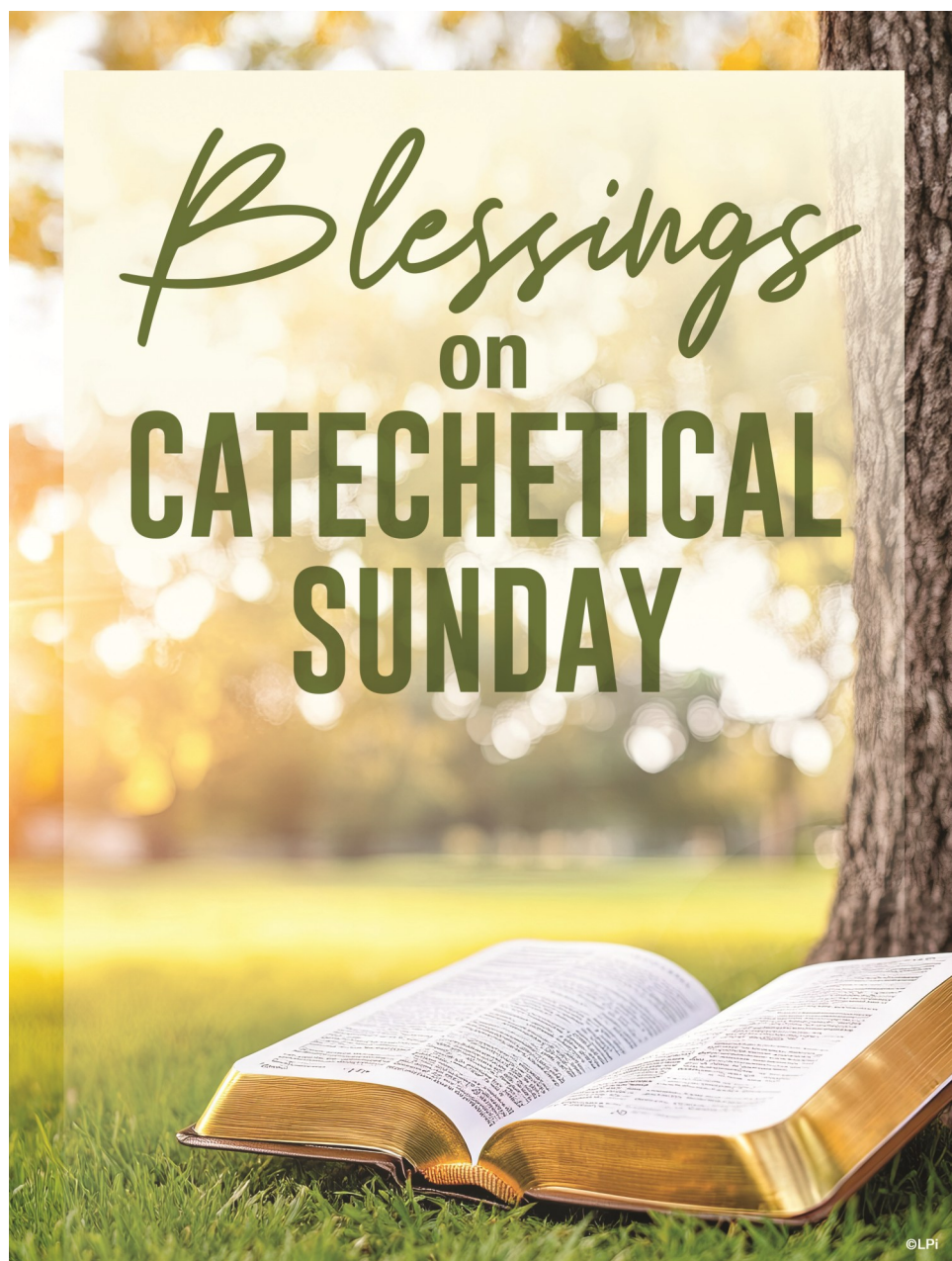

This week's message is for all those who are tired of hearing me ask for money and/or talk about the building fund. Well, the requests are over; we have reached the pledge goal of \$4.5M!! Thank you, thank you! 😊

Some of the pledges for the campaign (Mary and I included) were made over a five-year period. We have made three payments and will be paying for the next two years, so just a gentle reminder for those who pledged in this manner.

If you have not toured the new addition, which is 6000 square feet both on the ground level and in the lower level (12,000 square feet total), any of us on the office staff would be happy to take you around. When Bishop Ricken was here last fall to preside at Mass and bless our addition, he commented how much he liked the addition, especially commenting that the space is "functional, but not extravagant." That is exactly what we were looking for in terms of design and cost effectiveness. It would be worth your time to tour it!

Occasionally, someone will say to me, "What can possibly go on there (the parish office) all week?" If that puzzles you as well, I would highly recommend you offer to volunteer to help in the office someday. We have wonderful volunteers, but we can always use the help. We will have something for you to do for the morning or an afternoon!

You should be very proud of your parish facility, your parish family, and most importantly, our love of God in this parish. The church itself is open every day from 8-4 at a minimum, but many times it is open into the evening. If you ever want to stop by and spend time with Jesus, you will love it!

Again, my most heartfelt appreciation to all of you who contributed; you are held in my prayers!

The Gospel leaves many of us puzzled about the steward. So, I investigated further. Several commentaries for the Gospel provided opinions on what the steward was doing, after all, it looks shady. Most commentary authors believe that the steward was simply crediting back what he had cheated people out of in the first place, material goods which he had intended to pocket for himself.

The first reading and the Gospel are tied closely together with the theme of how we deal with our worldly goods. Amos describes a series of techniques to cheat those who are needy and vulnerable. In the Gospel we see that the steward also cheated people. Yet, in today's world getting ahead, getting more material goods, and getting more money, is what society is advertising as what success looks like. However, when the end tries to justify the means, that is when dishonesty becomes normal in our lives so that we can get more worldly goods, that is when, as the Gospel tells us, we begin to serve mammon, not God. Remember the 10th Commandment, "Thou shall not covet thy neighbor's goods."

Being thankful for what we have, not envious of what others have, can bring us to an inner peace. Sharing what we have with others in need brings us to what Christ is asking of us, to love our neighbor.

In Paul's letter to Timothy, he speaks of leading a quiet and tranquil life in devotion and dignity. When we approach life in that way, I believe that we are now serving God, not mammon.

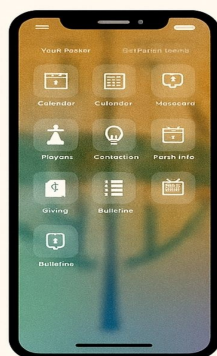

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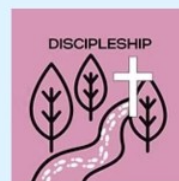

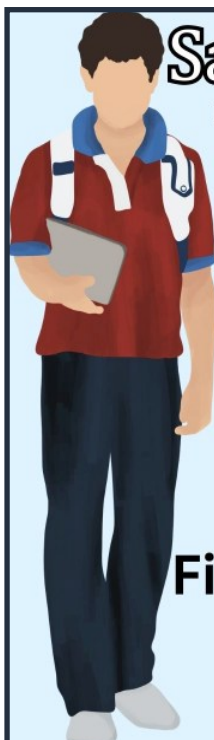
