

Deacon Jeff's Corner

Over the Easter season, Bishop Ricken released his instruction on the practice of Holy Communion under both kinds – the Precious Body and Precious Blood of Jesus. As not to keep you in suspense as you read this, the prayerful decision Bishop has made is to allow the Cup to be distributed on certain special occasions. Those days will follow at the end of my corner, but I hope you will read what, through the Holy Spirit, brought Bishop to this decision.

In the early days of the Church, there seemed to be a common practice of offering both Eucharistic species to the faithful. However, this practice became less frequent and virtually disappeared around the 12^{th} century. The Council of Trent (1545-1563), among many other topics, reinforced that it was pastorally inappropriate to return to offering Holy Communion under both kinds to the lay faithful.

The Second Vatican Council (1962-1965) and the liturgical documents that followed encouraged that the Church restore the practice of offering the Precious Blood during some of the most important celebrations of the Mass within the liturgical year. What was intended to happen on particular Solemnities, Feasts and Celebrations became the norm. Many dioceses around the country, including here in Green Bay, offered the Precious Blood to everyone at every Mass.

The Catholic Doctrine of Concomitance states that when we receive Holy Communion under the form of the consecrated host, we receive the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Our Lord Jesus. The same applies to His Precious Blood. Thus, we lose *nothing* of Jesus' love for us in the Eucharistic form of His Precious Body.

Bishop Ricken has decided the Practice of Holy Communion under both kinds to only take place, but also be encouraged during the following liturgical celebrations, beginning with the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus (this year on June 1-2). Other celebrations include:

- *The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (Nov. 23-24)
- *The Christmas Mass at Midnight
- *Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper
- *Holy Saturday Mass of the Easter Vigil
- *Divine Mercy Sunday
- *The Solemnity of Pentecost
- *The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Bishop Ricken spent extensive time in prayer and reflection to come to this decision. May we all respect his decision, given to him through the guidance of the Holy Spirit.


