

Deacon Jeff's Corner

My dear friends, we have now arrived at the most holy week of the year for us as Catholic Christians. It is so appropriately named!

Holy Week should be a week like no other in our calendar year. Many optional activities, as well as conveniences could (should) be suspended this week. Our prayer lives, even if they have changed for the better in this Lenten season, can be turned up a bit more this special week. If you haven't experienced the Sacrament of Reconciliation this season, it should be a part of your priority list this week.

More than anything, I would like every one of you to consider celebrating the Triduum with us here at Prince of Peace. The Triduum is so named because the first three letters – "Tri" – mean three. In this case, the "three" are days: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Please allow me to explain further.

The Triduum is, in essence, <u>one</u> Mass. It begins on Holy Thursday, which is the celebration of the Last Supper Jesus had with his apostles. It is *the* event from which the Eucharist was born, where Jesus gave them bread and said, "This is my body" and wine, saying "This is my blood". This was not metaphorical language as some might suggest, but Jesus giving them his actual body and blood in the form of bread and wine. It is what is represented every time we come to Mass! Holy Thursday ends in silence with the entire altar being stripped.

Good Friday is a continuation of the prior evening and begins and ends in silence. It is NOT a Mass, but rather a service; a remembrance of the horrible suffering and death Jesus experienced for every sin we have ever and will ever commit. It is a solemn, but very powerful service.

Holy Saturday begins in darkness. Jesus is in the tomb. But the light begins with a small fire, lighting the Easter candle which is processed into church. From this one light, everyone in attendance is given a candle that is lit from the Easter candle. Suddenly, the church is filled with the light of Christ, who is risen from the dead! Lights come on, the Gloria is sung amidst bells ringing in celebration, and our catechumens and candidates are brought into full communion in the Catholic Church!

Celebrating these three days *will* change your life and make the Easter season so much more meaningful. Please try to celebrate with us!




