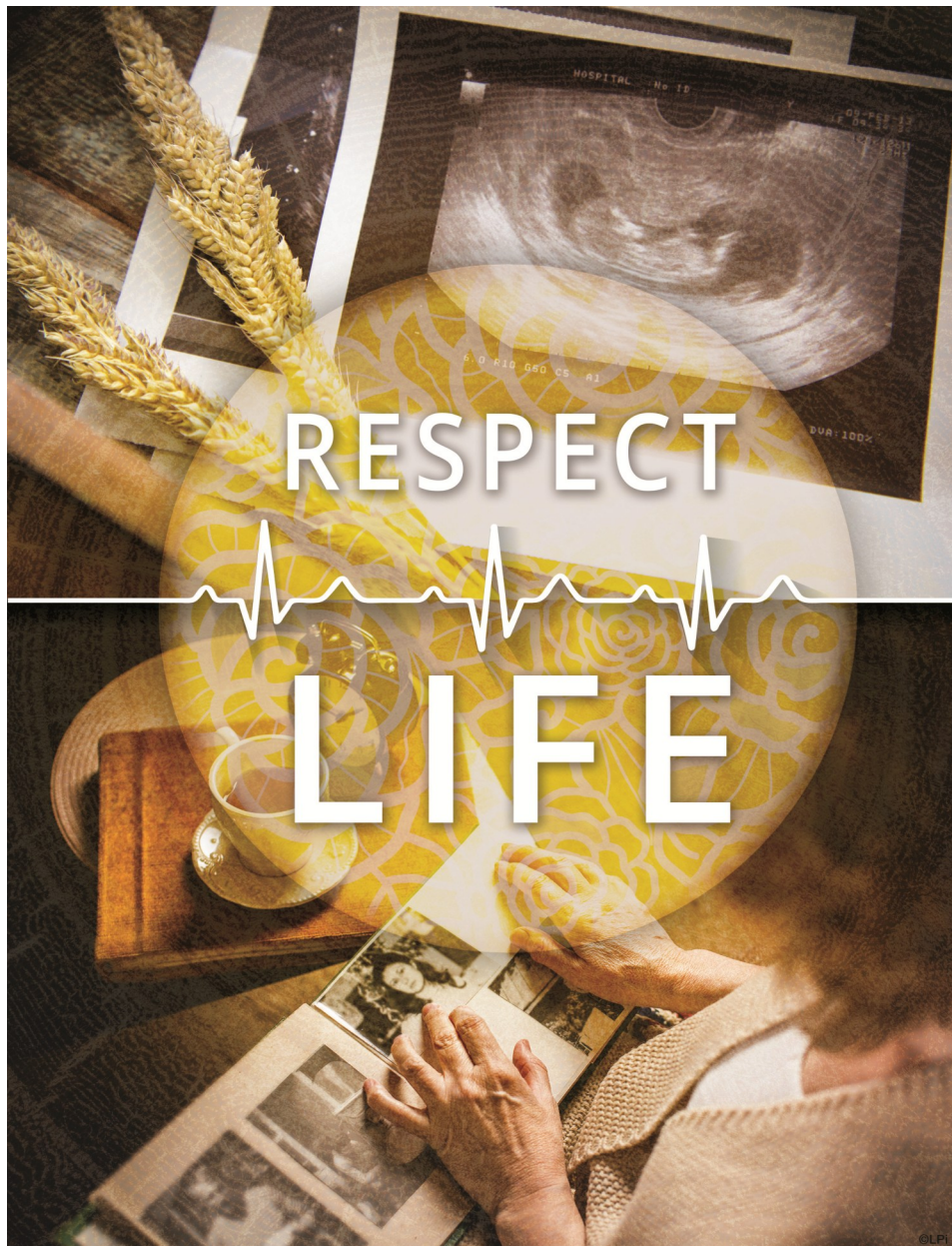

Deacon Jeff's Corner



The month of October is known in the (Catholic) Church as the "Month of the Rosary". There are many prayers we have at our disposal, but there are none as powerful as the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Although this is the formal name of the Rosary, St. Pope John Paul II had this to say about the Rosary, and particularly the Hail Mary (said 53 times in the Rosary): "The center of gravity in the Hail Mary, the hinge as it were which joins its two parts, is the name of Jesus."

So, there are two "complaints" if you will about the Rosary: First, it is too repetitive, so that it has no meaning. There are four different sets of mysteries of the Rosary, being the Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious, and Luminous Mysteries. That is 20 different mysteries to ponder as you say the Rosary, which are always good to reflect on. Second, you may say it's too long and you don't have time to pray a Rosary. I used to think the same, but with apps galore with different voices, background music, and length of times, I believe you can pray the Rosary daily. If you are concerned about time, try praying the Rosary with Fr. Rocky on the Relevant Radio app (15 minutes). I usually pray the Rosary when I'm out on my daily walk, and it allows me to center on the day ahead or reflect on the day ending.

Finally, there is true power in the Rosary. Many of the saints have commented that Satan hates the Rosary, and the prayer Satan hates the most is the Hail Mary. So, if you've never or very seldom prayed the Rosary, try it in this month of October. Who knows? It may just become a part of your life!

A Reflection on the Weekend Readings

*"How long, O LORD? I cry for help
 but you do not listen!"*

The opening words of our first reading today from the prophet Habakkuk are raw and real. We don't know the details of the situation that Habakkuk finds himself in, but we do know the result is violence, destruction and misery. Habakkuk calls out to God; he questions whether God is even listening. Even worse, he wonders whether God has abandoned him.

Have you ever found yourself in the shoes of Habakkuk, that in a moment of despair you have called out to God and wondered if your words were falling on deaf ears? Or wondered if God has simply walked away? I know I have.

One of the themes in today's readings is the gift of faith. Habakkuk's actions might lead us to believe that he lacked faith. But I would suggest that the opposite is true. The fact that Habakkuk took his grievance to God suggests that he believed God could make things right. His pleas – even in anger and despair – suggest that he indeed had a relationship with God. Had he no faith, no hope, Habakkuk might have chosen not to waste his breath crying out to God.

In the end, God showed Habakkuk that he was listening. God answers Habakkuk's pleas with a vision. God listens to our cries as well. May we express that which is deep in our heart with confidence and faith that we are heard. May we know that God will never abandon us.
